# rewards for rgvlead scholars

Seniors who graduate as RGV LEAD Scholars qualify for these rewards:

### GRADUATION HONORS

RGV LEAD Scholars will receive an RGV LEAD honor cord and RGV LEAD Scholar certificate to signify their accomplishments.

### SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

RGV LEAD Scholars are eligible to compete for one of the RGV LEAD Scholarships ... thousands of dollars for college! (This is in addition to the savings of earning college credits in high school as RGV LEAD Scholars.)

### DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT

A student must earn distinguished level of achievement to be eligible for top 10% automatic admission. A student may earn a distinguished level of achievement by successfully completing:

- Four credits in mathematics, which must include Algebra II
- Four credits in science
- The remaining curriculum requirements
- The curriculum requirements for at least one endorsement.

### PERFORMANCE ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Students may earn Performance Acknowledgments in several ways. RGV LEAD Scholars have the opportunity to qualify through "outstanding performance in dual credit" course or for earning a nationally or internationally recognized business or industry certification or license.

# RGVLEAD scholars program

To graduate as an RGV LEAD Scholar, a student must meet all four of these requirements:

- Complete all courses required for the Foundation High School Program (FHSP) with at least one Endorsement.
- Complete the high school portion of a six- or eightyear program of study that includes, in high school, a coherent sequence of two or more career and technical education courses for 3 or more credits.
- 3. Complete at least two college-level courses as part of the high school graduation plan. Each college-level course must meet all of the following requirements:
  - a. Must be a career and technical education course taken for high school credit.
  - b. Must be either an articulated course for which the student has earned a grade of 80 or better or a dualcredit course for which the student has earned a passing grade.
  - c. Must be a course that is included in a college-andcareer focused program of study graduation plan.
- Complete a declaration of intent to be an RGV LEAD Scholar.

### THE FOUNDATION HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM (FHSP)

English: 4 credits (English I, II, III and one Advanced English course)

Mathematics: 3 credits (Algebra I, Geometry, and one Advanced Math course)

Science: 3 credits (Biology, IPC or Advanced Science, plus one Advanced Science)

Social Studies: 3 credits (U.S. History, U.S. Government (1/2 credit), Economics (1/2 credit) and World Geography, World History, or Combined World History/Geography

Physical Education: 1 credit

Languages Other Than English: 2 credits

Fine Arts: 1 credit Electives: 5 credits

### **OPTION ONE**

### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. Complete the course required for the Foundation High School Program (FHSP) with at least one Endorsement
- 2. Computer the high school portion of a six-or eight year program of study that includes in high school,
- 3. Complete at least three college-level courses as part of the high school graduation plan or complete a recognized CCMR Industry-Based Certification included in the 2019-2020 Approved TEA Certification list.
  - a) Must be Career and Technical Education courses taken for high school credit
  - b) Must be CTE dual course credits for which the students has earned a passing grade
  - c) Must have a coherent sequence of CTE courses in an approved TEA Endorsement with at least 4 earned credits
- 4. Complete a declaration of intent to be an RGV LEAD Scholar

The rationale under item #3 is to be in clear alignment with TEA CCMR requirements of which one of the important indicators is for students to complete 9 college hours in any subject (including technical); this would be the equivalent of 3 CTE dual courses and not 2. The other is on students completing one of the approved CCMR industry-based certifications on the approved 2019-2020 certification list.

### RGVLEAD scholars program

To graduate as an RGV LEAD Scholar, a student must meet all four of these requirements:

- 1. Complete all courses required for the Foundation High School Program (FHSP).
- 2. Complete at least one endorsement from a CTE career cluster option.
- 3. Earn an industry-based certificate or license through the selected career cluster option or earn a passing grade for at least two college-level courses through the selected career cluster option.
- Complete a declaration of intent to be an RGV LEAD Scholar.
